Education in the News, Again: Education is a hot topic right now; attendance, school spending, achievement and Structured Literacy.

Postgate School has been doing Structured Literacy since 2017/18. A former teacher, Rachel Woodley-Higgins, had a passion for phonics and set up a Junior School programme to prove it would make a difference for our students. While other schools were doing Play-Based Learning, Whole Language or whatever, Postgate was working with a world expert (who lived just up the road from Postgate) Joy Allcock.

Over the past two years, various Junior School teachers have been working with the University of Canterbury doing the Better Start Literacy Approach (BSLA). It has been interesting working with the university and comparing what we have done over the past several years. In some areas, we believe Postgate's way is of more benefit. Smiley face here!

While it is pleasing to see this programme rolled out for every school in New Zealand, for us we have used a considerable amount of our money to purchase resources and invest in teachers; now, schools will receive this money. Oh, for a refund!

Structured Literacy is only one moving part of many for a quality education. We still have to throw in many other areas. The key ones being; teacher quality, parental engagement, quality of the early years and attendance at school.

Attendance: Last week 83% of children attended school 90% or more of the time; compare that to how New Zealand is tracking. Imagine if we had 90% 90% of the time! Oooo lala.

Our weekly attendance rate was 94%.

Year 7s had the highest attendance rate of 98%.

Year 4s were the lowest at 88%.

All other year groups were in the 90% bracket.
