Professional Learning and Development (PLD)

Teachers in Years 4–8 are undertaking in-depth learning through the University of Canterbury to strengthen their understanding of the *Better Start Literacy Approach (BSLA)*, already in place in Years 1–3.

You may also be aware that the Ministry of Education is rolling out a *Curriculum Refresh*—a new direction for how we teach and measure progress. Teachers are actively engaging with these changes, and at the end of Term 2, you'll hear more about your child's progress in relation to the refreshed curriculum during our **Learning Conversations**.

📊 Attendance – Our Focus This Term

This term, we're taking a firmer stance on attendance—because it truly matters. Every day missed is a missed opportunity to learn, grow, and stay connected.

Here's what we've noticed:

- 12 students had attendance below 70%. 9 of them did not start their schooling at Postgate.
- 30 students had attendance below 80%, with only 6 having valid reasons.
- 82 students had attendance below 90%, missing more than 5 days last term.

By ethnicity:

• 36 Māori students

- 16 Samoan students
- 10 NZ European students

By year level:

- 33 students in Years 1–3 (critical learning years)
- 32 in Years 4–6
- 17 in Years 7–8

Whole-school statistics:

- **Postgate's daily attendance rate:** 92%
- Lowest day: Friday (90%)
- Highest year-level rate: Year 6 (93%)
- Lowest: Year 2 (89%)
- Māori: 89% | Samoan: 92% | NZ European: 93%
- Females: 90% | Males: 92%

While 76% of students attend more than 90% of the time (up from 69% last year!), a small group (14 students) are tracking to miss over a term this year—with limited valid reasons.

We want to stress: **regular attendance is vital**. When kids fall behind early, it becomes much harder to catch up. In the near future, families may face fines for unjustified absences.

Let's continue to work together to ensure every child is here, ready to learn.
